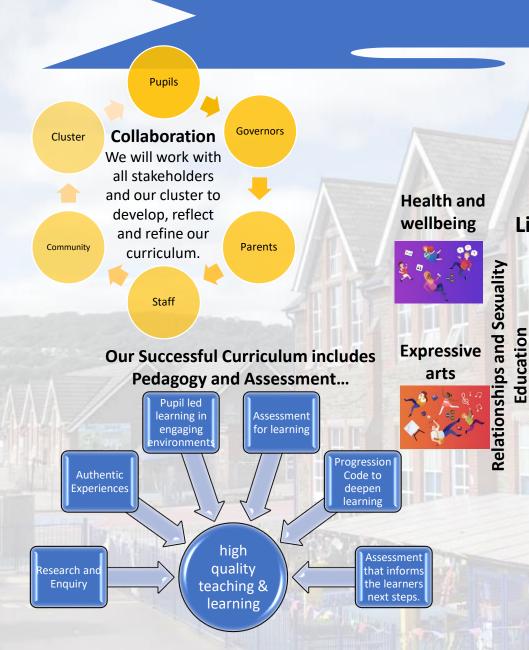

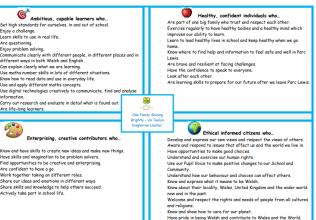

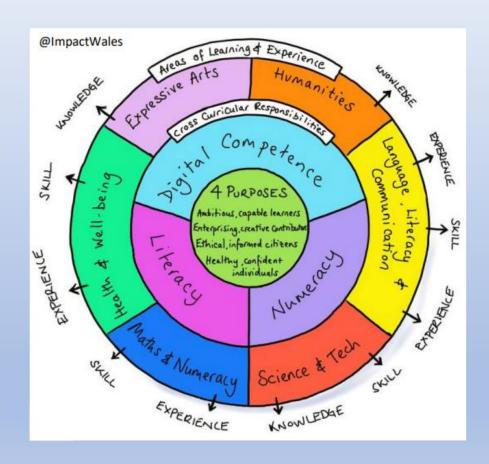

The number system is used to represent and compare relationships between numbers and quantities

Algebra uses symbol systems to express the structure of mathematical relationships

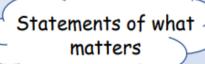
Healthy relationships are fundamental to our well-being

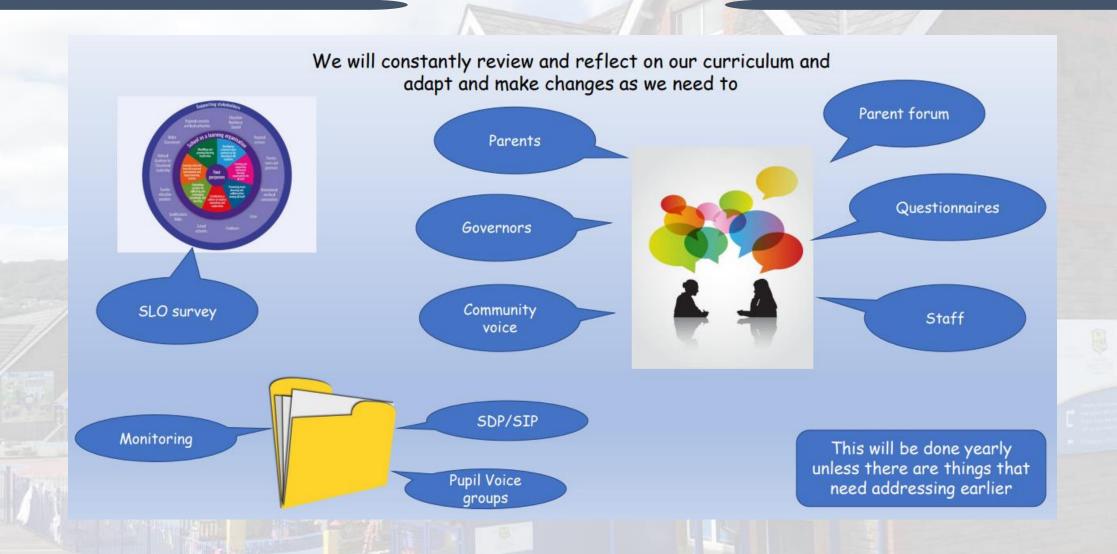
