




Happy New Year!



PARKING

Please remember that The Broadway is an extremely busy road, particularly before and after school. Please don't put our children at risk by parking on any double yellow lines/zig-zags. The PCSO's will be doing regular checks and handing out on the spot fines for anyone caught parking illegally.

Parents are now able to short term park on the Broadway, the KS2 entrance side in the 'pull-in' area.

RCT have also now commissioned an enforcement parking team, who will be targeting schools in particular for dangerous/illegal parking and can also issues fines of £70.00



School Trips

At the beginning of a new topic, generally termly, we try and give the children a 'hook' to encourage new learning.

We try and vary this hook between inviting guests in, taking the children for a local visit and also taking them a little further by bus.

These trips are a valuable tool both to stimulate children's learning and for the socialising aspect of Primary School.

Welsh Government Universal Primary Free School Meals

As I'm sure you're all aware from September 2022 all Reception age pupils are now eligible for Free School Meals. From January of this year, (2023), all Year 1 pupils are now eligible for a Free School Meal. From the start of the Summer Term all Year 2 children will then be eligible for a free school meal. Alongside this all nursery children, when they become full time, are also eligible for a free school meal. This scheme will roll out across KS2 during the next academic year.

However, if your child is eligible for a free school meal due to living in a low-income household then the FSM form still needs to be filled out and returned to RCT in order to also receive the holiday dinner funding for children and Uniform Grant which is over £100.00
