
# Welcome Back!

## DINNER MONEY ARRANGEMENTS

Regarding the provision of school meals, please note the following: -

We are now a "cashless school" – all dinner money must be paid through the RCT online payment facility.

If your child/ren require dinners, please email admin@parclewisprimary.rctcbc.cymru

to obtain the unique reference number, needed to credit EACH individual account – one payment to a unique number cannot be split and shared between siblings in the school.



We kindly ask that Parents/Guardians continue to....

- make every effort to drop off and collect their child/ren at the associated times for their class. Please remember to follow the one-way system at drop off and collection times. Please note internal school gates are locked at 8.55am
- No cars are permitted in the car park at anytime unless prior permission has been given by school.
- Where possible please avoid making appointments for your child/ren during school hours. If an emergency appointment is unavoidable and you will be dropping your child off late or collecting early, please ensure you have emailed the school notifying them of the times you will be arriving at the main door, and have also informed the class teacher of the times. We can then order a school lunch for your child.

#### **PARKING - SAFETY ISSUES**

Please remember that Parc Lewis Primary is situated on an extremely busy road. Please don't put our children at risk by parking on any double yellow lines/zig zags on either side of the school.

Parents and local residents regularly voice their serious concerns relating to the illegal parking which occurs on a daily basis around the school. Recently there have been some near misses as parents try and cross roads between illegally parked cars.

The PCSO's will continue with regular checks and issue on the spot fines for anyone caught parking illegally. RCT have also commissioned an enforcement parking team, who are targeting schools in particular for dangerous/illegal parking and are issuing fines of £70.00

It is not school's role to enforce safe parking <u>outside</u> of the school gates. School has a Traffic Management plan for the inside of the school gates. We can only continue to ask parents/guardians for your help when picking up and dropping off our children.
